

Focus of this release

The focus of this AMC 2.6 SP1 release is primarily on the rebranding of the product, the support of the upcoming new Avira Professional Security for Mac and on increasing the stability and reliability of the product as a whole.

Avira Management Console 2.6 SP1

1. Renaming of the product to Avira Management Console

According to the Avira rebranding the product will be released under its new name “Avira Management Console”.

The new name will be used on the surface only, i.e. in window titles, messages, events, logfiles, templates etc. This will also include new brand graphical elements. The renaming will not be done for file names, services, directories etc..

The new name “Avira Management Console” is part of the renaming of all Avira products. It strengthens the customers’ brand awareness and aligns the product within the restructured Avira product portfolio.

2. Renaming of the Avira Internet Update Manager to Avira Update Manager

As well as the AMC itself, its update component is also renamed from Avira Internet Update Manager to Avira Update Manager. This renaming is done for the Avira Update Manager as part of the AMC as well as for the Avira Update Manager as a stand-alone product. The renaming is done to the same extent as with the AMC.

3. Supporting Avira Professional Security

The AMC 2.6 SP 1 will, of course, continue to support the Avira 2012 products for Windows but it will also be prepared to support the upcoming new Avira Professional Security for Mac. This “Mac-Support”, however, will not be unlocked in the AMC 2.6 SP 1 until the Mac product itself is released in 2012.

4. Adding new Avira EULA (End User License Agreement) to products

The Avira Management Console, the Avira Small Business Security Suite, the Avira Update Manager and the new Avira Endpoint Security will be released with the new Avira EULA with the new contact address Avira Operations GmbH & Co. KG, Kaplaneiweg 1, 88069 Tettngang.
